**Brief Claim Description:**

This claim relates to Canada's failure to protect the settlement lands of Teequaloosh at Spuzzum. Canada accepted the claim into the Specific Claims negotiation process on October 18, 2019. Spuzzum First Nation executed a BCR on September 01, 2020 agreeing to enter into negotiations with Canada under the Specific Claims Policy, which BCR is still in effect. A 2020-2021 Workplan was signed by Spuzzum on October 29, 2020. On February 16, 2021, Canada offered basic negotiation funding in the amount of \$30,695.


**SECTION G - WORK PLAN SUBMISSION**
