

Community Hub

The intent of Community Hub designation is to act as the centre of Spuzzum First Nation, featuring a mix of housing, administration, recreation, community and cultural facilities. Community gardens and greenspaces will be encouraged, especially in residential areas. Development of sidewalks, installation of signs, and lighting will promote the safety of our community members and visitors. A network of pathways will connect this area to other areas within Spuzzum First Nation.

Mixed Use

The intent of the Mixed Use designation is to provide a variety of community and economic development opportunities. The designation utilizes the highway frontage and existing infrastructure, which supports the development of a mix of housing and employment uses for Spuzzum First Nation members and retail uses for members and non-members. Examples of retail uses may include a tourism centre, gift shop, convenient store, and a gas station. Existing community and cultural places will be enhanced and new places will be provided to support the gathering of the community and to provide play areas for children. Community access to the Fraser River will be encouraged where possible.

Recreation

The intent of the Recreation designation is to provide outdoor recreational spaces and facilities to support an active lifestyle and healthy living for Spuzzum First Nation members. The designation inloudes a mix of active and passive uses. Active uses include buildings and structures for outdoor leisure and athletic activities and can include sport fields, tracks, parks and playgrounds, including a pit house. Passive uses include land and water for non-intensive leisure activities such as trails and boardwalks. The existing transmission corridor Right-of-Way may be integrated into the existing and future network of pathways to connect the various areas on Spuzzum. The vision is to promote recreational opportunities while respecting the area's natural features.

Light Industrial & Commercial

The intent of the Light Industrial / Commercial designation is to take advantage of the prime highway frontage along Highway 1, Light Industrial / Commercial provides space for light industrial employment uses that are environmentally benign and do not include heavy industrial uses (such as manufacturing). Uses may include warehousing, offices, supportive services (such as a convenience store), as well as logging-related uses. It is important to locate employment uses that support light industrial activities away from residential areas and traditional, cultural, and spiritual sites, such as the cemetery to minimize any potential negative impacts (e.g., noise and dust).

The intent of the Employment designation is to provide a commercial and economic development hub for Spuzzum First Nation, creating opportunities for member employment. Fronting on high traffic areas, such as along Highway 1, Employment will support a variety of commercial activities, including the selling and renting of products and/or services to Spuzzum First Nation members and non-members.

Tourism

The natural beauty of the Fraser River and Spuzzum First Nation's proximity to Alexandra Bridge Provincial Park offer the potential for commercial tourism opportunities. The intent of the Tourism designation is to promote tourism-related economic development opportunities that respect the area's natural features and Spuzzum's traditional, cultural, and spiritual practices. Commercial tourism actives may include an ecolodge, camping, hiking, fishing, and boating, as well as guided tours.

The Future Development designation provides for a variety of potential future development opportunities to support community needs. These lands may be appropriate to include a mix of residential, commercial, and community uses. Further studies will be required to determine the best use of the land. Until road access is established to area's designated with this land use, it is envisioned that natural features will be protected and support current traditional, cultural, and spiritual practices, such as mushroom harvesting.
